Discussion Questions

- 1. Have you ever written a love letter or poem? Are these even cool anymore? Do you have a favourite love song?
- 2. In the first chapter we see that the Young Woman is clearly attracted, but feels like she is too "dark" to be seen (S of S. 1:5-6). Have you ever felt as though you were too dark, unlovable, or unworthy? How did God and His people help you to see otherwise?
- 3. The Young Woman's brothers erect obstacles to her own value and relationships. Who or what attempts to keep us from the love and goodness of God?
- 4. The Young Woman asks "where are you leading your flock" and the reply is basically "follow those who follow me" (S. of S. 1:7-8). Where can people find Jesus today? Where can people find the One who helps them overcome the obstacles to experiencing the goodness of God and draws out their created value and beauty?
- 5. Read S. of S. 1:11. Why is it important to see that the Young Man takes the initiative to make earrings of gold and beads of silver? What do these represent? What initiative has Jesus taken in our lives to draw out value and beauty and to bestow love?
- 6. Read S. of S. 1:12-13. How do you see Jesus, the cross, and the atonement in verses 12-13? Remember the word "*kopher*?"
- 7. Jesus says you are "like a lily among the thistles" (S. of S. 2:2). What do thorns represent and why is this such an encouraging verse for us?
- 8. Read S. of S. 8:6-7. God's love is: (i). INVINCIBLE (ii). PRESERVING (iii). TRANSFORMING (iv). CONQUERING (v). PRICELESS. Find these traits in these verses and then describe how and why God's love is each of these things for you.
- 9. What is the overall message in the Song of Solomon and why is it so important?
