4 Keys To Joyful Relationships

Plenty Of Affirmation

"I thank my God upon every remembrance of you..." vs. 3

Hard to enjoy those you are constantly critical of. Mindful ... Prayerful ... Hopeful

Plenty Of Confidence

"...being confident of this very thing, that He who has begun a good work in you..." vs. 6 Misplaced confidence ruins relationship. Proper confidence frees relationships. Confidence in GOD

Plenty Of Heart Space

"...because I have you in my heart,..." vs. 7

Takes effort to get people in your heart. Takes effort to keep people in your heart. You have to fit people in ... MAKE SOME ROOM!

Plenty Of Affection

"...how greatly I long for you all with the affection of Jesus Christ." vs. 8

Only those who have a genuine love relationship with Jesus can express genuine affection.

You only love to the degree you have been loved.

You don't love because a person is lovable but because you have been loved.

3. Stretching

STRETCH!

When our muscles are active, their constant contractions and extensions aid in the process of moving blood through the capillaries, the microscopic vessels that service most of our bodies' cells. When the muscles are inactive for long periods, the blood has a harder time moving through the capillaries; this results in a decrease of oxygen in the muscle tissue and an increase in the waste products that the blood normally carries away.

During sleep, most of our skeletal muscles are normally "switched off" by the brain to prevent potentially harmful motion, and blood pressure gradually drops. Upon awakening, our muscles are oxygen-starved and loaded with irritating waste, and the brain needs a blood pressure increase to prepare the body for activity, especially standing up. All of those issues are addressed by a good stretch. The simultaneous elongation or contraction of almost every major muscle group flushes out waste, brings in oxygen, and boosts blood pressure. Notice what happens to your heart beat next time you have a good morning stretch; the rate temporarily increases as does the force of the beat, all to handle these changes in the blood supply.

They're Intentionally Intrusive

Celebrate each other without reservation. It should be our Natural impulse!!! Criticism is cowardly self praise.

Speak the truth in love. (You have a piece of lettuce on your teeth.)

Paul cared too much for the community they were building. It was authentic. There was no room for any form of bigotry or racism. He loved Peter enough to confront his public sin in public. He had a public face to face encounter with Peter to guard the quality of community they had worked so hard to forge.

Galatians 2:11-13 "...Peter had come to Antioch, I withstood him to his face, because he was to be blamed; for before certain men came from James, he would eat with the Gentiles; but when they came, he withdrew and

separated himself, fearing those who were of the circumcision. And the rest of the Jews also played the hypocrite with him,..."

A young man who was raised in a Jewish home. His dad was zealous in attending worship and religious instruction. When the family was forced to move to another city in Germany, there was no synagogue in the city. All the pillars of the community attended the Lutheran church. The influence of the hypocrisy of his father has been felt around the world. Tell me that integrity doesn't matter.

Pslam 133

Harmony is as refreshing as the dew from Mount Hermon that falls on the mountains of Zion. And there the Lord has pronounced his blessing, even life everlasting.

Abiding in community is wonderful and pleasant. So many benefits of real community!!!

For over 75 years, Harvard's Grant and Glueck study has tracked the physical and emotional well-being of two populations: 456 poor men growing up in Boston from 1939 to 2014 (the Grant Study), and 268 male graduates from Harvard's classes of 1939-1944 (**the Glueck study**).

The conclusion? According to Robert Waldinger, director of the Harvard Study of Adult Development, one thing surpasses all the rest in terms of importance:

"The clearest message that we get from this 75-year study is this: Good relationships keep us happier and healthier. Period."

Laminin: cell-adhesion molecule It tells the cell what its job is in the body. It's like the 'rebar' of the human body...it's the glue




