Ezekiel.

2 Chronicles 35:25

"The prophet Jeremiah composed funeral songs for Josiah, and to this day choirs still sing these sad songs about his death. These songs of sorrow have become a tradition and are recorded in The Book of Laments."



Jeremiah 1:5-12

"The Lord gave me this message: 'I knew you before I formed you in your mother's womb. Before you were born I set you apart and appointed you as my prophet to the nations ... I am watching, and I will certainly carry out all my plans."

Josiah legislates worship of God ... creates a place of mixture.

They do the temple and their other forms of idolatry.

A return to law keeping could never change the heart.

Self improvement only leads to more sin ... pride, comparison, division, oppression.

Jeremiah 20:8-9


