### Discussion Questions

1. Rom. 8:30 "And those he predestined, he also called; those he called, he also justified; those he justified, he also glorified." (Glorified (dox-ad'-

zo):—to make glorious, adorn with lustre, clothe with splendour, to impart glory to something, render it excellent. ).

What did Paul mean by glorified, and is this past, present, or future?

2. Read Neh. 2:17-18. Nehemiah invites the people to respond to his plan for restoring the city. What was their response? What is our response to the Holy Spirit coming to work in our lives? What work is he doing in our lives now, in light of the finished work of the cross?
3. Nehemiah's name means divine counsellor / helper. As a type of the Holy Spirit, what does Nehemiah's arrival on the scene with authority, resources, and manpower show us about the Holy Spirit's activity, and about His commitment to restoration in our lives?
4. Have you ever built a wall or a fence? Why? Why did the walls and gates of Jerusalem need repair? What foundational truths need to be restored in our lives to keep us from being vulnerable to attack?
5. Why do you think Nehemiah was so frustrated that he actually "called down curses...beat some of them and pulled out their hair" (Neh. 13:25)?
6. Malachi prophesied to a frustrated people "'I have always loved you,' says the Lord." To which they reply, "Really? How?" (Malachi 1:2) Why do you think the people were questioning God's love? Think about this from the perspective of their whole history throughout the Old Testament and try to imagine what would you think if that was your history and experience?
7. What types of questions would you have for God at the end of the Old Testament if that was all you had?
8. Read Malachi 3:1-3. Why is this such good news? What do you see in these verses that would cause the people to know that it's all going to be ok?
9. What were a couple of your highlights on the journey through the Old Testament? What are you most looking forward to about the New Testament?
