Why do we quit?

1. Seemingly Shattered Promises and Broken Expectations.

In a word... disappointment!



Peter's broken expectations...

Matthew 16:22

"And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him, saying, "God forbid it, Lord! This must never happen to





2. Personal Failure "I will never be made to stumble."

3. Comparison / Competition

"Even if all are made to stumble..."

* Matthew 26:33 (NKJV)





Jesus Puts Peter Back in the Game ...

1. Jesus meets Peter at the original place of promise and breathes hope again into all his seemingly lost promises.

2. Jesus Addresses Peter's Personal Failure.

Denied him x 3. + Do you love me? x 3.



Strong's Concordance : agapaó: to love Original Word: ἀγαπάω

HELPS Word-studies "to prefer, to love... embracing God's will (choosing His choices) and obeying them through His power."



Strong's Concordance phileó: to love Original Word: φιλέω Usage: I love (of friendship), regard with affection, cherish; I kiss.

HELPS Word-studies

"properly, to show warm affection in intimate friendship, characterized by tender, heartfelt consideration and kinship."



3. Jesus addresses Peter's propensity to compare and compete.

John 21:20 & 22

...Peter turned and saw the disciple whom Jesus loved following them...what is that to you? Follow me!"



Just some thoughts about comparison...

Romans 14:4 "Who are you to judge another's servant? To his own master he stands or falls. Indeed he will stand, for God is able to make him stand."





1 Cor. 4:3-5 "... its a small thing to be judged by you or by any human court. In fact, I do not even judge myself... Therefore judge nothing before the time."



Peter would later develop a new default, and not quit.
